- 1. People and places pictured in the photo; any affiliation (eg, if it's a school teacher, name the school they worked in); and a few words on whateverthe occasion photographed was about. Please pay VERY CAREFUL attention to the proper spelling of names; please MAKE SURE all names are spelled correctly including those we wrote down here, as whoever wrote on the backs of the photos may or may not have had spellings correct.
- 2. The year (or approximate year) the photo was taken.
- 3. The provenance of the photo. That's ideally the photographer's name, but if we don't have the photographer's name, then the source of the photo (eg it could be "Photo by John Smith," or "Photo courtesy Fort Walla Walla Museum" or "Photo courtesy of John Smith family").

For some of these we may not be able to get any information. Or the info might be incomplete. Just get what you can.

The information needs be captured in a Word document with numbering that correlates to the photos.
