Public Content

Staff met with Robert McAndrews, Public Works Director, to select an appropriate location for the Poor Farm Cemetery Monument. The attached Exhibit A shows the proposed location in the northwestern part of the Cemetery at the intersection of Mockingbird Dr. and Sandpiper Ln. The monument will have good visibility from Mockingbird Dr. looking east from Larch Ave toward the Cemetery. The foundation slab will be approximately 3'x16', placed six feet back of curb with a depth of excavation not exceed 18" (6" concrete slab with 6" 3/4" minus crushed rock, up to 6" to adjust for grade).

During the Ground Penetrating (GPR) project in 2021, no burial sites were identified in this area of the cemetery. That being said, a city staff representative will be on site during the excavation process. It is likely that some regrading of the slope around the monument will occur to reestablish grades. The irrigation system will also likely require some modification to prevent overspray on the monument.

The Poor Farm Cemetery Sign will be removed and a smaller pared down sign will replace it that will give some brief information about the Walla Walla County Poor Farm and Poor Farm Cemetery and a QR Code link to more digitally provided information.

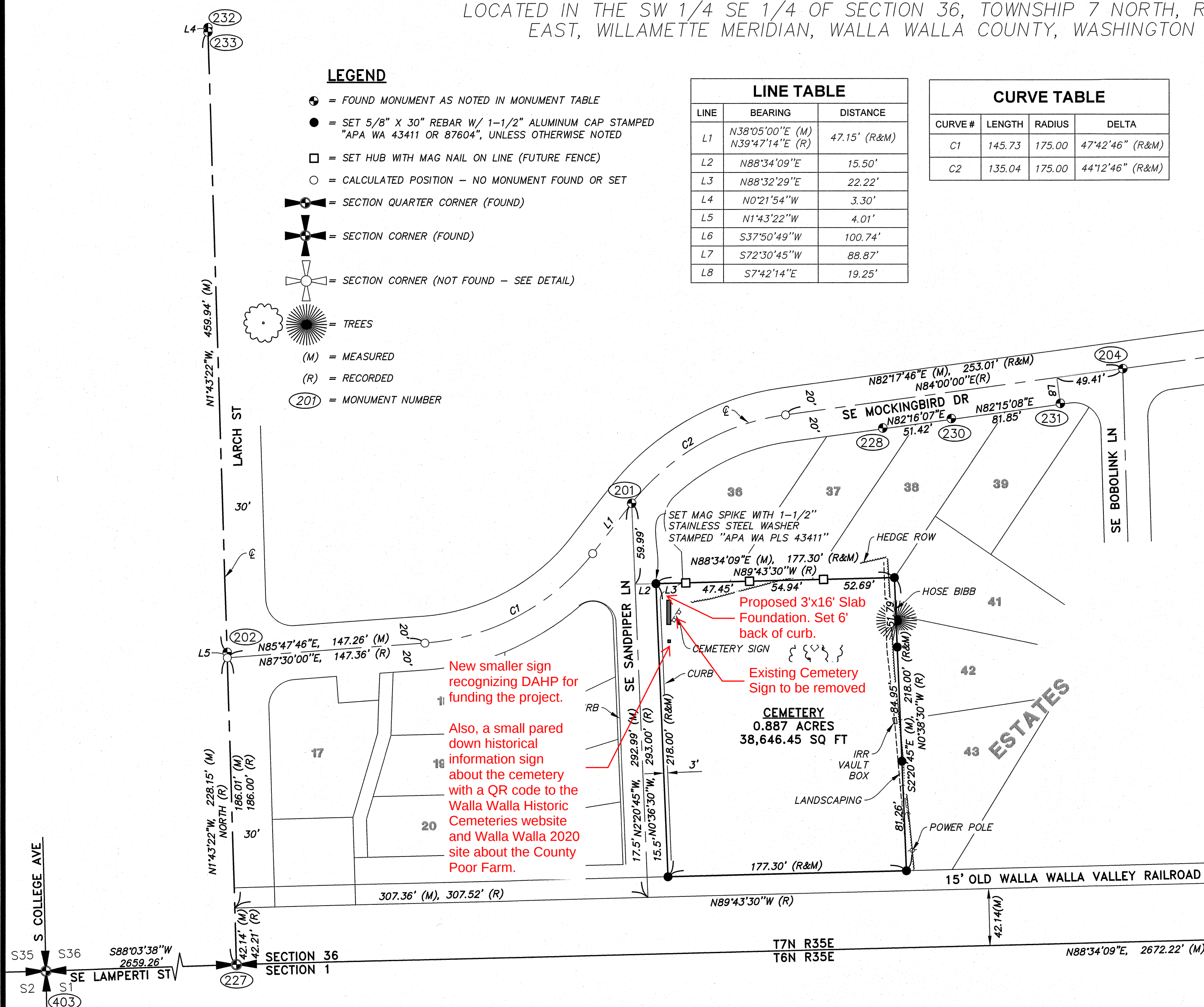

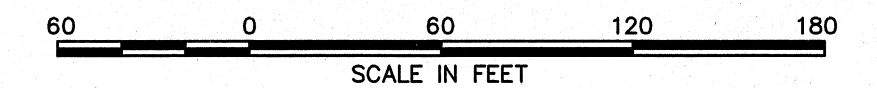
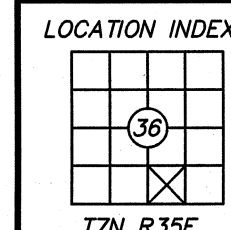

POOR FARM CEMETERY

The Walla Walla County Poor Farm Cemetery was established here in 1891. Deceased Poor Farm residents along with unclaimed remains from the Walla Walla County Coroner’s office were buried here in rows running north to south. Most graves were marked with small concrete cylinders bearing only a number. Upright markers were later placed on several of the graves by family members. Family and friends were able to find the names and location of the graves of persons buried here by consulting records maintained at the county courthouse, which have recently been discovered. After the Poor Farm closed and as the

adjoining land was being developed the larger markers were removed, the concrete cylinders were covered with soil, grass was planted over them, and playground equipment was installed on top of the graves, footings for which are still visible. The cemetery is currently owned by the City of College Place, and is protected from disturbance by Washington’s Historic Cemeteries and Graves Act. Photos of the Poor Farm house which still stands nearby on Scenic View Drive and several of the grave markers are shown below, along with names of those buried here.
