Public Content

Historical Perspective:

On December 10th 2019, Council approved Ordinance No. 19-026 establishing a moratorium for a duration of one year from the date of adoption of the ordinance. The Council may renew the moratorium for one or more six-month periods following a public hearing on such renewal.

Information for Consideration:

The Washington State legislature has authorized the growing of industrial hemp as part of an agricultural pilot program in conformance with the Agricultural Act of 2014.

The 2018 Farm Bill passed by the United States Congress and signed into law by President Trump included regulating hemp as part of the agriculture industry and no longer included with marijuana as a federal Schedule 1 drug.

In June of 2019, the Washington State Department of Agriculture issued an industrial hemp grower license to Matthew Hardy to grow industrial hemp at 221 NE Larch Ave. College Place, WA 99324.

Over the course of the growing season the City has received numerous complaints regarding the odor of the growing of industrial hemp.

The City has a responsibility to protect the public health, safety, and welfare.

The Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 36.70A.390 authorizes the City to adopt a moratorium of up to one year with the adoption of a work program.

The adoption of a moratorium on the acceptance of applications, the issuance of permits, and/or the operation of facilities associated with the growing of industrial hemp would enable the City to further research to determine if commercial agricultural production of hemp is an appropriate land use in residential zones and how best to implement the state laws governing industrial hemp as they now exist or as they may be subsequently amended.

On December 10th 2019, Council approved Ordinance No. 19-026 establishing a moratorium for a duration of one year from the date of adoption of the ordinance. The Council may renew the moratorium for one or more six-month periods following a public hearing on such renewal. The ordinance included a work plan.

Public notice of the hearing was published on January 14th and posted in three public places (City Hall, Police & Fire Departments).

Public Content

Historical Perspective:

Over the years a variety of ordinances and resolutions have been passed regarding council meetings and rules. The first Ordinance was passed in 1984 and the first rules Resolution in 1990.

In 2016, it became apparent there was a need to compile all the meeting rules into one document. After a couple of meetings, without a conclusion on the issue and the tabling of the proposed comprehensive resolution, (N0. 881), the task was assigned to an ad-hoc committee made up of three Council Members. One member of this ad-hoc committee has since passed away.

Discussion at a recent council workshop indicated the difficulty of compiling one document from the various previously passed rules, and the City Clerk was tasked with assisting in this project.

Information for Consideration:

The attached exhibits are copies of those original enacting documents as well as minutes from the meetings creating the ad-hoc committee and the tabled 2016 comprehensive resolution.

In addition, the compilation document created by the Clerk, and a proposed Resolution based on that document are included.

The proposed Resolution would eliminate items from "Resolution" that are regulated by "Ordinance" so that there are not conflicting meeting times and dates in City legislation. The other addition made was to note that speaking time can not be transferred to another person as recommended by the City Attorney.

Public Content

Historical Perspective:

On April 3, 2019, the City awarded a contract to Schneider Equipment, Inc. to drill Test Well Well No. 6 (Test Well No. 2) with a 15% contingency for a total not-to-exceed expenditure authorization of \$848,158.93.

Information for Consideration:

On January 21, at Schneider Equipment, Inc.'s request, the City and RH2, the City's design consultant, conferred with them regarding recurring sloughing within the Test Well No. 2 well shaft during drilling operations. Schneider noted concerns that, absent placement of a temporary casing, the drilling operation was ineffective and instead was resulting in the removal of large quantities of sloughed materials. RH2 advised and the City requested that Schneider prepare three options for completing the well. Option 1 was to complete the well as currently drilled; Option two was to install the temporary casing and complete the well at 730 feet below ground surface (BGS). The final option was to install the temporary casing and continue the well to 800 feet. This is in the same range of depth as what was drilled for Test Well No. 1. On 1/23/2020, based on Schneider's estimates, RH2 provided preliminary total project estimates for each option as follows:

Opt. No 1 - No Temp Casing and drilling to 685' BGS: \$1,052,709.08

Opt. No 2 - Temp Casing and drilling to 730' BGS: \$1,211,349.15
Opt. No 3 - Temp Casing and drilling to 800' BGS: \$1,319,486.85

The first option is effectively the same as our current contract (\$737,529.50) except that additional permanent stainless steel liner, beyond the original length assumed in the bid documents and contract, would be installed to and may stop a few feet above the original contract depth of 700 ft*. In addition there are additional costs associated with the pump test (\$100,000) as the methodology had not been determined at bid and cleaning the lower bore hole due to sloughing (\$67,850).

Current testing indicates that well production may be better than what has been experienced at Test Well No. 1/Well No. 4 (1700 gpm), but absent a sustained pump test, this is not considered conclusive. A well test without placement of the casing has the potential to damage the well shaft and so this is not considered a feasible alternative.

It is also unknown how much draw down will be needed in order to maximize withdrawals. Draw down not only impacts current well performance, but over time, additional depth in a well allows it to continue functioning longer if aquifer levels continue decreasing. Drilling deeper also increases the opportunity for tapping into additional water producing zones. This is not guaranteed; Test Well No. 1 did not penetrate additional water producing zones when drilled deeper to 800 feet, though it's draw down characteristics warrant a deeper shaft.

RH2 is recommending drilling to 800 feet in order for the well to be deep enough to support current and future drawdown and in order to maximize the potential to tap into additional water bearing strata. Staff concurs with their recommendation with the understanding that the costs for additional well depth are not insignificant. The City currently has an application in to the Department of Health for a supplemental Drinking Water State Revolving Loan for \$2,663,063 that would more than cover this increase. If the City is not successful in obtaining this loan, the City's current general obligation water bond would provide funding.

Staff met with the Public Works Committee on 1/23/2020 to brief them on RH2 recommendations. The Public Works Committee recommended proceeding with Option 3 (Drilling to 800 feet) and maintaining a 20% contingency against new work as contemplated by pursuing Option 3 as estimated in RH2's letter.

On 1/24/2020, RH2 provided finalized updated costs reflecting recent project payments and aligning their projections against Schneider's third option (See Exhibit 3**). RH2's recommendations identify an additional \$100,000 for a well pump testing discharge line not included in Schneider's proposal. Staff is proposing including the estimated \$100,000 cost along with the 20% contingency as the full project discretionary expenditure authority over the actual contract amendment. This will allow Mayor or Administrator to authorize the discharge line once the actual price is known. This would total \$226,998.21 in discretionary authority. This amount plus the contract amendment of \$442,485.09 over the original \$737,529.50 contract would result in a total expenditure authorization of \$1,407,012.80 (60% increase). Current contract authorization (including original contingency) is for \$848,158.93. By approving this action, Council would be increasing the total contract authorization by \$558,853.87 to \$1,407,012.80 (66% increase). This contract change (w/o contingencies) is expected to increase total project costs by 16% from \$3,470,037.89 to \$4,021,222.98 (see Exhibit 4).

*Stainless steel liners are preferred in that they provide for a much greater open area compared to open cut slots in a steel liner. This allows for greater well productivity. The stainless Vwrap wire also holds back sediment better than slots in a steel liner. The open cut slots in the steel liner are more prone to corrosion and encrustation. Most basalt wells have some biofouling risk.

**Note that Exhibit 3 has been modified to reflect extraction of the projected \$100,000 in discharge line expenses from the recommended contract amount and into the discretionary expenditure authority to reflect that this cost has not yet been finalized by Schneider.

Public Content

Historical Perspective:

The City applied to the Transportation Improvement Board (TIB) and was successful at receiving funding for an overlay on Lamperti Street. The City opened bids on Thursday, January 16, 2020 and received 5 bids. The base bid was set on the requirements of the TIB. Alternates were added in hopes of receiving good prices on the 3 alternatives and would be at the City's expense. The alternatives dealt with #1 - quarry spalls at the west of the retaining wall on the north side of the street, #2 - approximately 680 square yards of sidewalk replacement, and #3 - a handrail adjacent to the sidewalk from Central down to Lamperti. It was felt #1 & #3 could be done for a lesser cost and staff does not recommend approval for those items. The 2nd alternate would replace failed and non-ADA compliant sidewalk.

Information for Consideration:

The portion of the expenditure not cover by TIB (\$60,654) will be covered by the reserve balance in the Street Fund (100). To offset this additional expenditure we had a \$20,000 savings on the budgeted Rock placed on Myra Road.

The City of College Place hereby proposes the following work program, subject to approval by the Mayor and City Council, to guide the research and preparation of regulations to govern the production, processing, and sales of hemp for industrial purposes:

1. The City staff, in consultation with state and local agencies as appropriate, will research the results and findings of the State Pilot program authorized through RCW 15.120, with a particular emphasis on:
 - a. State licensed growing operations within residential neighborhoods; and
 - b. The extent to which the state-licensed growing operations have resulted in complaints of odors and/or adverse impacts on the public health, safety, and welfare of the community.
2. The City staff will also monitor the deliberations of the Washington State Legislature during the 2020 legislative session to determine if the state intends to continue the industrial hemp pilot program, and under what terms and conditions;
3. The City Staff will present the findings of their research to the Planning Commission and City Council.
4. Based on direction provided by the Mayor and City Council, the City Staff will prepare and present to the Planning Commission potential revisions to the College Place Municipal Code to address the production, processing, and/or sales of commercial hemp in the City.
 - a. All Planning Commission meetings will be open to the public.
 - b. The City will post working drafts of proposed revisions to the Municipal Code on the City's website.
5. Upon completion of any draft regulations to govern of the production, processing, or sales of industrial hemp in the City, the document will be circulated for review and comment by the public, as well as state agencies, and neighboring jurisdictions.
 - a. A public hearing will be conducted by the Planning Commission during the review and comment period.

ORDINANCE NO. 19-026

AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLLEGE PLACE, WASHINGTON TO ESTABLISH A MORATORIUM ON THE ACCEPTANCE OF APPLICATIONS, THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS, AND/OR THE OPERATION OF FACILITIES ASSOCIATED WITH THE PRODUCTION AND PROCESSING OF HEMP FOR INDUSTRIAL PURPOSES; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Whereas, the City of College Place is a non-charter code city governed by the rules and regulations of RCW 35A; and

Whereas, the City of College Place, Washington has prepared and is implementing a comprehensive plan and development regulations in accordance with the provisions of the Washington State Growth Management Act; and

Whereas, the Growth Management Act authorizes the City to periodically amend its Comprehensive Plan and Development Regulations; and

Whereas, the City completed a review and update of the College Place Comprehensive Plan in 2018; and

Whereas, the City completed a review and update of its Development Regulations in 2019; and

Whereas, the Washington State legislature has authorized the growing of industrial hemp as part of an agricultural pilot program in conformance with the Agricultural Act of 2014; and

Whereas, the 2018 Farm Bill passed by the United States Congress and signed into law by President Trump included regulating hemp as part of the agriculture industry and no longer included with marijuana as a federal Schedule 1 drug; and

Whereas, the Laws of Washington State governing the growing of industrial hemp expire on January 1, 2020; and

Whereas, the State of Washington issued a license for growing industrial hemp in the city limits without providing the City with an opportunity to comment or to determine if the use complies with the provisions of the College Place Municipal Code; and

Whereas, the City has received complaints about the odors associated with this commercial agricultural activity; and

Whereas, additional research is required to determine if commercial agricultural activities, such as growing of industrial hemp, is appropriate in residential zones within the city limits; and

Whereas, given the uncertainty about the state regulations governing the pilot program to license the production, processing, and sales of hemp for industrial purposes; and

Whereas, the City's responsibility to protect the public health, safety, and welfare is of paramount importance; and

Whereas, the Revised Code of Washington (RCW) 36.70A.390 authorizes the City to adopt a moratorium of up to one year with the adoption of a work program; and

Whereas, the adoption of a moratorium on the acceptance of applications, the issuance of permits, and/or the operation of facilities associated with the growing of industrial hemp would enable the City to further research to determine if commercial agricultural production of hemp is an appropriate land use in residential zones and how best to implement the state laws governing industrial hemp as they now exist or as they may be subsequently amended; and

Whereas, the City will conduct a public hearing within 60 days of the adoption of this moratorium as required by RCW 36.70A.390 and has prepared a work program so that the moratorium may be in effect for up to one year; and

Whereas, the adoption of a moratorium on the acceptance of applications, the issuance of permits, and the operations of facilities associated with the production and processing of industrial hemp for industrial purposes is necessary to protect the public health and safety and is in the public interest.

Now therefore, the City Council of the City of College Place do hereby Ordain as follows:

Section 1 Moratorium Established. A moratorium is established in the City of College Place on the acceptance of applications, the issuance of permits, and/or the operation of facilities associated with the production, processing, and sales of hemp for industrial purposes in accordance with the provisions of state laws and regulations.

Section 2 Duration of the Moratorium. This moratorium shall be in effect immediately upon approval and shall remain in effect for one year from the date of adoption of this ordinance unless terminated by action of the City Council. The City Council may renew this moratorium for one or more six-month periods following a public hearing on such renewal. The City hereby adopts the Work Program attached as Exhibit A or as subsequently amended.

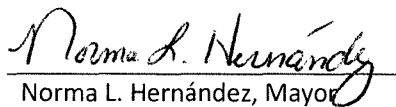
Section 3 Administrative Code Interpretations Authorized. In the event of any question or uncertainty regarding the applicability of this moratorium the Mayor or his/her designee is hereby authorized to make such administrative code interpretations as may be necessary to implement this moratorium.

Section 4 Clerical Corrections. The City Clerk and the codifiers of this ordinance are authorized to make necessary clerical corrections to this ordinance including, but not limited to, the correction of scrivener's/clerical errors, references, ordinance numbering, section/subsection numbers and any references thereto.

Section 5 Severability Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstance, be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid for any reason, or should any portion of this Ordinance be pre-empted by state or federal law or regulation, such decision or pre-emption shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance or its application to other persons or circumstances.

Section 6 Effective Date This Ordinance, as a public emergency ordinance necessary for the protection of the protection of the public health, public safety, public property, or public peace, shall take effect and be in full force and effect immediately upon adoption. Pursuant to *Matson v. Clark County Board of Commissioners*, 79 WN. App 641, 904 P. 2d 317 (1995), underlying facts necessary to support this emergency declaration are included in the "WHEREAS" clauses, above, all of which are adopted by reference as findings of fact as if fully set forth herein. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon passage. The City Clerk is directed to publish a summary of this ordinance, consisting of the title, at the earliest publication date.

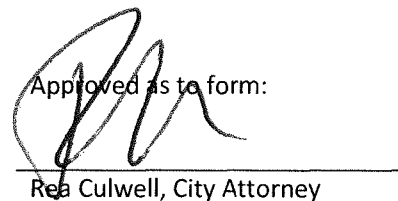

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL of College Place, Washington as follows:

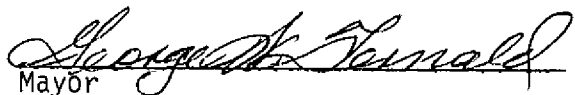

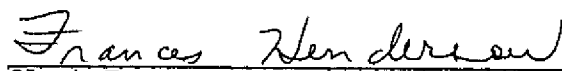

A RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH RULES OF CONDUCT FOR COUNCIL MEETINGS.

WHEREAS, a predetermined order of procedure for City Council meetings will be the most expedient means of conducting Council Meetings, and

WHEREAS, such order of procedure will avoid confusion and aid in the expeditious handling of business.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLLEGE PLACE DOES RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

A RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH RULES OF CONDUCT FOR COUNCIL MEETINGS

I. GENERAL RULES

- 1.1 Meetings to be public: All official meetings of the Council shall be open to the public with the exception of the executive sessions for certain limited topics, as defined in Section 2.3.
- 1.2 Quorum: Four Councilmembers shall be in attendance to constitute a quorum and be necessary for the transaction of business. If a quorum is not present, those in attendance will be named and they shall adjourn to a later time.
- 1.3 Compelling Attendance: The Council might adjourn from day-to-day to compel the attendance of absent members.
- 1.4 Journal of Proceedings: An account of all proceedings of the Council shall be kept by the City Clerk and shall be entered in a book constituting the official record of the Council.
- 1.5 Ordinances: Confined to One Subject; Exceptions: No ordinance except an appropriation ordinance, an ordinance adopting or embodying an administrative or governmental code, or an ordinance adopting a code of ordinances, shall relate to more than one subject, which shall be clearly stated in its title.
- 1.6 Right of Floor: Any member desiring to speak shall be recognized by the Chair, and shall confine his or her remarks to the subject under consideration or to be considered.
- 1.7 City Attorney: The City Attorney shall attend all meetings of the Council, unless excused by the Mayor. Any member of the Council may, at any time during a regular or special meeting of the Council, call upon the City Attorney for an oral or written opinion to decide any question of law.
- 1.8 City Clerk: The City Clerk, or such other person as the Mayor may designate, shall be ex officio Clerk of the Council and shall keep minutes of the Meeting and perform

such other further duties in the meeting as may be ordered by the Mayor.

- 1.9 Officers and Employees to Attend: The head of any department or any officer or employee of the City, when requested by the Mayor, or the City Council, shall attend any regular, executive or special meeting and confer with the Council on matters relating to the City.

2. Types of Meetings

- 2.1 Regular Council Meeting: The Council shall meet on the second and fourth Mondays of each month at seven-thirty p.m. When a Council meeting falls on a holiday, the regular meeting shall be held on the following Tuesday at the same hour unless otherwise provided by motion. The City Council may cancel, reschedule, or convene regular meetings at a different date or time by a motion. If a meeting is relocated, final action may be taken only on agenda items. The place of the meeting shall be the Council chambers in the city hall, and all regular and special meetings shall be public.

- 2.2 Special Meetings: Special meetings may be called by the Mayor or any three members of the Council. The City Clerk shall prepare a notice of the special meeting, stating the time, place, and object, and personally serve notice upon each of the City Council at least 24 hours before the time of meeting. The City Clerk shall attempt to notify each member of the council in person, either by telephone or otherwise, of the special meeting. The city clerk shall give notice of the special meeting to each local newspaper of general circulation and to each local radio and television station which has filed with the clerk a written request to be notified of special meetings. The city council may not discuss nor make final disposition of any matter not mentioned in the notice.

Special meetings may be called in less than 24 hours, and without the notice required in this section, to deal with emergencies involving injury or damage to persons or property or the likelihood of such injury or damage if the notice requirements would be impractical or increase the likelihood of such injury or damage.

- 2.3 Executive Sessions: Executive sessions or closed meetings may be held in accordance with the provisions of the Washington State Open meetings Act. Topics that may be discussed are: (1) Personnel matters, (2) Considerations of acquisition of property for public purposes or sale of City-owned property, (3) Potential or pending litigations in which the City has an interest, and any other as provided in the Revised Code of Washington. (42.30.110)

Conducting of:

- a. Executive sessions must be part of a regular or special meeting. (RCW 42.30.110)

b. Before convening in executive session, the presiding officer must publicly announce the purpose for excluding the public and the time when the executive session will conclude. The executive session may be extended by an announcement of the presiding officer. (RCW 42.30.100 (2))

c. Final adoption of an "ordinance resolution, rule, regulation, order or directive" must be done in the "open" meeting. (RCW 42.30.060)

2.4 Attendance of Media at Council Meetings: All official meetings of the City Council and its committees shall be open to the media, freely subject to recording by radio, television and photographic services at any time, provided that such arrangements do not interfere with the orderly conduct of the meetings.

3. Chairman and Duties

3.1 Chairman: The Mayor, if present, shall preside as chairperson at all meetings of the Council. In the absence of the Mayor, the Mayor Pro Tem shall preside. In the absence of both the Mayor and the Mayor Pro Tem, the Council shall elect a Chairperson.

3.2 Call to Order: The meetings of the Council shall be called to order by the Mayor or, in his absence, by the Mayor Pro Tem. In the absence of both the Mayor and the Mayor Pro Tem, the meeting shall be called to order by the City Clerk for the election of a temporary Chairperson. Four Councilmembers shall be in attendance to constitute a quorum.

3.3 Preservation of Order: The Chairperson shall preserve order and decorum, prevent attacks on personalities or the impugning of member's motives, and confine members in debate to the question under discussion.

3.4 Questions to be Stated: The chairman shall state all questions submitted for a vote and announce the result. A roll call vote shall be taken upon the request of any member.

3.5 No member shall speak more than twice on the same subject without permission of the presiding officer.

3.6 Motions to reconsider must be by a member who voted with the majority, and at the same or next succeeding meeting of the Council.

3.7 Each member present should vote on all questions put to the council, except as to matters with respect to which such Councilmembers has a disqualifying interest.

3.8 The presiding officer of the Council may, at his or her discretion call any member to take the Chair, to allow him or her to address the council, make a motion, or discuss any other matter at issue.

3.9 All questions of order shall be decided by the presiding officer of the Council with the right to appeal to the Council by any member.

3.10 A motion for adjournment shall always be in order.

4. Creation of Committees, Boards, and Commissions

4.1 Citizen Committees, Boards and Commissions: The Council may create committees, boards, and commissions to assist in the conduct of the operation of the city government with such duties as the Council or Mayor may specify.

4.2 Membership and Selections: Membership and selection of members shall be as recommended by the Mayor and approved by the Council. Any committee, board, or commission so created shall cease to exist upon the accomplishment of the special purpose for which it was created, or when abolished by a majority vote of the Council. No committee so appointed shall have powers other than advisory to the council or to the Mayor unless otherwise specified.

4.3 Removal of Members of Boards and Commissions: The Council may remove any member of any board or commission which it has created by a vote of at least a majority of the Council.

5. Citizen's Rights

5.1 Addressing the Council: Any person desiring to address the Council by oral communication shall first secure the permission of the presiding officer.

5.2 Manner of Addressing the Council - Time Limit: Each person addressing the Council shall give his/her name and address in an audible tone of voice for the record and, unless further time is granted by the Council, shall limit their address to five minutes. All remarks shall be addressed to the Council as a body, and not to any member thereof. No person, other than members of the council and the person having the floor, shall be permitted to enter into any discussion, either directly or through the members of the Council. No questions shall be asked the Councilmembers, except through the presiding officer.

5.3 Personal and Slandorous Remarks: Any person making personal, impertinent or slanderous remarks, or who shall become boisterous, while addressing the Council may be requested to leave the meeting and may be forthwith, by the presiding officer, barred from further audience before the Council during that Council meeting.

5.4 Reading of Protests: Interested persons, or their authorized representatives, may address the Council for the reading of protest, petitions, or communications relating to any matter over which the Council has control, when the item is under consideration by the Council, if a majority of the Council present agrees to let them be heard.

5.5 Mayor May Appoint Committee or Refer Citizens' Complaints: The Mayor may appoint a committee of three members of the City Council to hear citizen's complaints or may refer citizen's complaints to an executive session of the City Council, whenever the subject would be appropriate.

5.6 Written Communications: Interested parties, or their authorized representatives, may address the Council by written communication in regard to any matter concerning the City's business or over which the Council had control at any time by direct mail or by addressing the City Clerk and copies will be distributed to the Councilmembers.

6. Suspension and Amendment of These Rules:

6.1 Suspension of these Rules: Any provision or these rules may be temporarily suspended by a vote of a majority of the Council. The vote on any such suspension shall be taken by ayes and nays and entered upon the record.

6.2 Amendment of these Rules: These rules may be amended, or new rules adopted, by a majority vote of all members of the Council, provided that the proposed amendments or new rules shall have been introduced into the record at a prior Council meeting.

7. Roberts Rules of Order, newly revised, shall govern the deliberations of the Council except when in conflict with any of the foregoing rules.

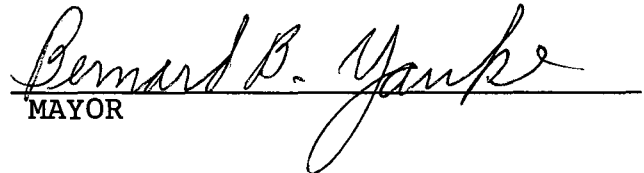

ONE-QUARTER PERCENT OF THE REAL ESTATE EXCISE TAX FOR ALL CITIES AND COUNTIES THAT ARE PLANNING UNDER THE NEW MANAGEMENT ACT AND HAVE A POPULATION OF MORE THAN 5,000.

ORDINANCE NO. 717

ORDINANCE IMPOSING AN EXCISE TAX ON THE SALE OF REAL ESTATE, PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION THEREOF, LIMITING THE USE OF THE PROCEEDS THEREFROM, AND FIXING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WALLEGE PLACE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: Imposition of real estate excise tax. There is hereby imposed a tax of one-quarter of one percent (0.25%) of the selling price on each sale of property within the corporate limits of this city.

SECTION 2: Taxable events. Taxes imposed herein shall be collected from persons who are taxable by the provisions of chapter 82.45 RCW and chapter 458.61 RCW upon the occurrence of any taxable event within the corporate limits of the city.

SECTION 3: Consistency with state law. The taxes imposed herein shall comply with all applicable rules, regulations, laws and court decisions regarding real estate excise tax as imposed by the state under chapter 82.45 RCW and chapter 458.61 WAC. The provisions of those chapters, to the extent they are not inconsistent with this ordinance, shall apply as though fully set forth herein.

SECTION 4: Distribution of tax proceeds and limitation on the use thereof.

a) The county treasurer shall place one percent of the proceeds of the taxes imposed herein in the city current expense fund to defray costs of collection.

b) The remaining proceeds from city taxes imposed herein shall be distributed to the city monthly. Those taxes imposed under Section 1 shall be deposited by the city treasurer in a municipal capital improvements fund. These capital improvements funds shall be used by the city solely for financing capital projects as defined by RCW 82.46.010(6) that are specified in a capital facilities plan element of a comprehensive plan and housing relocation assistance under RCW 59.18.440 and 59.18.450.

c) This section shall not limit the existing authority of this city to impose special assessment on property specially benefited thereby in the manner prescribed by law.

SECTION 5: Seller's obligation. The taxes imposed herein are the obligation of the seller and may be enforced through the action of debt against the seller in the manner prescribed for the foreclosure of mortgages.

SECTION 6: Lien provisions. The taxes imposed herein and any interest or penalties thereon are the specific lien upon each piece of real property sold from the time of sale or until tax is paid, which lien may be enforced in the manner prescribed for the foreclosure of mortgages. Resort to one course of enforcement is not an election not to pursue the other.

SECTION 7: Notation of payment. The taxes imposed herein shall be paid to and collected by the treasurer of the county within which is located the real property which was sold. The county treasurer shall act as agent for the city within the county imposing the tax. The county treasurer shall cause a stamp evidencing satisfaction of the lien to be affixed to the instrument of sale of conveyance prior to its recording or to the real estate excise tax affidavit in the case of used mobile home sales. A receipt issued by the county treasurer for the payment of the tax imposed herein shall be evidence of the satisfaction of the lien imposed in Section 6 of this ordinance and may be recorded in the manner prescribed for recording satisfaction or mortgages. No instrument of sale or conveyance evidencing a sale subject to the tax may be accepted by the county auditor for filing or recording until the tax is paid and the stamp affixed thereto; in case the tax is not due on the transaction, the instrument shall not be accepted until suitable notation of this fact is made on the instrument by the county treasurer.

SECTION 8: Date payable. The tax imposed hereunder shall become due and payable immediately at the time of sale and, if not so paid within thirty days thereafter, shall bear interest at the rate of one percent per month from the time of sale until the date of payment.

SECTION 9: Excessive and improper payments. If, upon written application by a taxpayer to the county treasurer for a refund, it appears a tax has been paid in excess of the amount actually due or upon a sale of other transfer declared to be exempt, such excess amount or improper payment shall be refunded by the county treasurer to the taxpayer: PROVIDED, that no refund shall be made unless the state has not authorized the refund of an excessive amount or an improper amount paid, unless such improper amount was paid as a result of a miscalculation. Any refund made shall be withheld from the next monthly distribution to the city.

SECTION 10: Severability. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstances is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.

SECTION 11: Effective date. This ordinance shall become effective 5 days after its passage, approval and

RESOLUTION NO. 872

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING PROCEDURES FOR FILLING VACATED COUNCIL MEMBER POSITIONS AND A VACATED MAYOR POSITION.

WHEREAS, in the event of a vacancy on the City Council or in the event the position of Mayor becomes vacant, such vacancies are to be filled according to the provisions of RCW 35A.12.050 and RCW 42.12.070; and

WHEREAS, RCW 42.12.070 provides that where one position becomes vacant, the remaining councilmembers appoint a qualified person to fill the position. Where two or more council positions become vacant and two or more councilmembers remain in office, the remaining members appoint a qualified person to fill one of the vacant positions and then the remaining councilmembers and the newly appointed person appoint another qualified person to fill the other vacant position, and so on until each of the vacant positions is filled; and

WHEREAS, if the council fails to appoint a qualified person to fill a vacancy within 90 days of the occurrence of the vacancy, the council's authority to fill the vacancy ceases and the county in which all or the largest geographic portion of the city is located is to appoint a qualified person to fill the vacancy; and

WHEREAS, any applicant to fill a vacant position must be a registered voter of the City at time of application and must be a resident of the City for a period of at least one year per *Lawrence v. Issaquah*, 84 Wn.2d 145 (1974); and

WHEREAS, the foregoing statutes are silent as to the procedure by which replacements are selected; and

WHEREAS, the absence of such a procedure has led to some confusion in the past, the result of which is that Council has determined to establish a written policy by resolution to be utilized in the future should vacancies on the Council or in the Office of Mayor occur;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of College Place does resolve as follows:

1. In the event of a vacancy on the Council or in the Office of Mayor, the City Clerk shall, within two weeks of the occurrence of such vacancy, publish a notice in the Walla Walla Union Bulletin notifying of such vacancy and soliciting written applications from qualified persons to fill such vacancy. The applications shall be accompanied by a written questionnaire to be completed by each applicant. Such notice shall be in a form acceptable to the City Administrator and the City Attorney.

2. Such notice shall establish a deadline for the submission of applications and answers to the questionnaires, which shall be no less than fifteen (15) days from the date the notice is published.

3. Once this deadline has passed, the City clerk shall review each application to ensure that each applicant is a registered voter of the City at time of application and has been a resident of the City for at least one year.

4. Once the Clerk has reviewed the applications to determine eligibility per the provisions of the preceding paragraph of this resolution, those applicants that are determined to be eligible shall be notified to appear before the Council to submit to an interview by the Council. Applicants will be asked to remain in the foyer when each separate applicant is interviewed, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the applicants as a group shall be advised that if anyone of them objects to this process, then they shall all be permitted to remain in Council Chambers for each interview conducted.

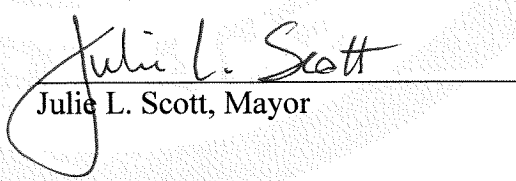
5. At the conclusion of all interviews the Council shall adjourn to executive session pursuant to RCW 43.30.110(1)(h) to evaluate the qualifications of the applicants, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that final action appointing an applicant to office shall be in a meeting open to the public.

6. Upon completion of the Executive Session, Council shall return to open session and the Mayor or Mayor Pro Tem shall request nominations from Councilmembers, who may then nominate the applicants of their choice. A second shall be required for each nomination. Only those that submitted applications shall be eligible for nomination.

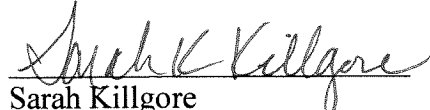
7. Council members shall then vote for the nominees of their choice. Absent members shall be permitted to vote by phone. The nominee with the majority of the votes cast is then selected to fill the vacancy. In the event of a tie the Mayor may vote. If no candidate receives a majority vote, Council may adopt motions to enable it to complete the election by majority vote within a reasonable time.

8. Resolution No. 355 (Rules for Conduct of Council Meetings) is hereby amended by adding a paragraph 1.11 captioned "Procedures for Filling Vacated Positions" to section 1 of said resolution setting forth paragraphs 1 through 7 of this instant resolution.

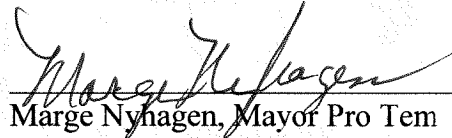

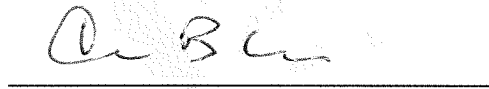

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE TIME AND PLACE OF HOLDING REGULAR MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLLEGE PLACE AMENDING CHAPTER 2.04 OF THE COLLEGE PLACE MUNICIPAL CODE AND REPEALING ORDINANCES NOS. 536, 716, AND 1139

Whereas, Ordinance 536 does not specify the correct location, time, or date of the regular meetings, and

Whereas, Ordinance 536 does not allow for modifications of the date in circumstances where there is no actionable or imminent items on the agenda, and

Whereas, Ordinance 716 specifies the correct time and location but not the correct date of the regular meetings, and

Whereas, Ordinance 1139 specifies the correct date, time, and location of the regular council meetings but does not allow for modifications of the date in circumstances where there is no actionable or imminent items on the agenda, and

Whereas, It has been determined that it would be reasonable and fiscally responsible to allow meetings with no actionable or imminent items to be postponed or cancelled,

Now therefore, the City Council of the City of College Place does hereby amend College Place Municipal Code Chapter 2.04 as follows:

Section 1: The regular meetings of the city council shall be held in the council chambers of City Hall at 625 South College Avenue on the second and fourth Tuesdays of each month at 7:00 p.m.

Section 2: Exceptions:

A: Should either or both of these dates fall on a legal holiday recognized by the State of Washington, the Council, at its prior meeting, shall set a date for that meeting only, agreeable to the Council members.

B: Should there be an agenda with *both*, no actionable items *and* no imminent items to be considered, in which case the Council or Mayor desires to postpone or cancel the meeting, they shall have the authority to do so through one of the following procedures, provided there would still be at least one meeting per month as required by RCW 35A.12.110.

1. To postpone a meeting to a later date, pursuant to RCW 42.30.090 the Council has authority to adjourn the meeting to a later date. To do so in advance of the meeting date, the council

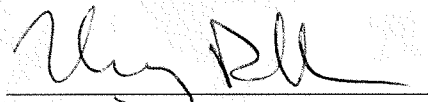
can cancel the meeting on the record during the preceding meeting. In the alternative, the council would be notified of the situation by the Clerk, and would respond directly to the Clerk so as to avoid a violation of the Open Public Meetings Act.

2. To cancel a meeting due to a lack of actionable or imminent items, the Council gives authority to the Mayor to do so, provided that a majority vote of the Council shall not override this decision.

Section 3: Severability. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section 4: Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force the 21st day of December, 2016 after its passage and publication as provided by law.

7. The Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure shall govern the deliberations of the Council when there is no specific guideline set in the foregoing rules, subsequent City of College Place Ordinances and Resolutions, or the statutes of the State of Washington – Specifically RCW 35A

Section 2: All reference to The Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure, 3rd Edition, by Alice Sturgis in Resolution No. 561 shall be amended as follows:

Section 3: In the event of a conflict between editions of The Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure, the most current version shall govern.

Section 4: Severability. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this resolution is declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this resolution.

Second by Councilmember Cleveland and the motion carried unanimously.

REGULAR AGENDA

Interim Police Chief Appointment

Mayor Scott spoke of the impending retirement of Police Chief Dennis Lepiane and thanked him for his years of service. City Administrator Pat Reay gave a summary of Chief Lepiane's history with the City. He explained that staff had reached out to the Washington State Association of Sheriffs and Police Chiefs to assist in selecting an individual to act as an interim Police Chief. Mr. Reay reviewed the qualifications of the individual who had been selected for this role, Mr. Larry Dickerson.

Mayor Scott noted that Mr. Dickerson would also be performing a sort of departmental audit while he was serving as interim Chief. Funding for this interim position was discussed.

Councilmember Schermann moved to authorize Mayor Scott to execute a service agreement to provide interim Police Chief Services to Mr. Larry Dickerson. Second by Councilmember Nyhagen and the motion carried unanimously.

Contract for Services – Water Rate Study

Finance Director Sarah Killgore reported that there had been no changes to the water rates since 2010. She noted that in 2014, the water system plan called for an increase to the water rates of 5% per year. This increase had not been implemented until 2016.

Mrs. Killgore stated that she had issued an RFP for a water rate study and had only received one proposal. The services that were a part of the study and the funding sources were explained.

Staff discussed the reasons behind the delay in implementing the rate increase that was recommended in 2014. Mr. Reay explained that with all of the projects that are currently occurring, the proposed increase after the water rate study could exceed the 5% that was recommended in the water system plan. Mrs. Killgore also explained that the contractor who would be performing the study would equip her with the tools to continue reviewing the rates into the future.

Councilmember Peterson moved to authorize staff to execute the attached water rate study contract with FCS Group in the amount of \$29,990, with an additional \$6,000 authorized for the Cost of Service Analysis Addendum, should it be necessary. Second by Councilmember Dickerson and the motion carried unanimously.

Repair of Non-Pot Pump

Public Works Director Paul Hartwig presented a request to repair a non-potable water pump at the wastewater treatment plant. He stated that it is critical that this pump be repaired as there are only two of them.

Councilmember Nyhagen moved to approve the repair of the non-pot pump for an amount not to exceed \$8,700. Second by Councilmember Dickerson and the motion carried unanimously.

Kiwanis Park Renovation – Professional Services Agreement

Senior Planner Jon Rickard explained the need to perform a cultural resource survey before the improvements were made to Kiwanis Park. He stated that Fort Walla Walla Museum will perform the survey for a cost of \$6,320. Mr. Reay stated that the survey was required by Executive Order 05-05 as there would be some ground disturbing activities as part of the project.

Councilmember Peterson moved to authorize Administration to execute a contract with Fort Walla Walla Museum for professional services associated with the Kiwanis Park Renovation project in the amount of \$6,320. Second by Councilmember Schermann and the motion carried unanimously.

CARS Project Intersection Configuration Review Report

City Engineer Robert Gordon presented the current intersection design for the CARS project and explained how that design was decided upon. Mr. Gordon stated that a series of public meetings had been held in 2013 to give the public an opportunity to comment.

Mr. Gordon gave a presentation to show the design for intersections on College Avenue from 4th Street through 10th Street. Mr. Gordon noted there were concerns from individuals who were losing their on street parking as a result of the intersection design. He stated the main reason for the current design was to improve safety.

The parking for the properties along College Avenue was reviewed. Mr. Reay explained that if any of the properties along College Avenue were redeveloped, they would be required to provide off-street parking.

Paving progress was discussed. Mr. Hartwig reviewed crosswalks, water and sewer lines, project cost, and other important project milestones. Mr. Reay explained the potential conflict between private utility companies and the project contractor in more detail.

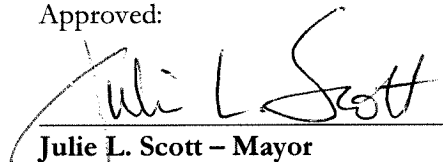

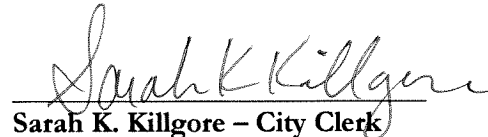

**West Side School District
Bicycle and Sidewalk
Improvements (4th Street
and Academy)**

City Engineer Robert Gordon discussed a grant application that would provide funds to install sidewalks and bicycle lanes along 4th Street and Academy Way. The City had been successful in receiving grant funds in the amount of \$149,662 from the Federal Transportation Alternatives Program and would like to request an additional \$250,000 from WSDOT. The total cost of the project was estimated to be \$562,587, so the City would be required to fund the remaining \$162,925. Mr. Gordon spoke about the options available for the project, right of way issues, and the design process.

Mr. Reay discussed potential University participation and its effect on right of way acquisition.

Council discussed parking issues along 4th Street, especially in front of the Gym.

The status of the roadway was discussed, and Mr. Gordon noted that staff may be coming back with a request for funds to improve that as well. Mr. Reay stated that staff would be requesting grant funds for that project also.

Councilmember Nyhagen moved to authorize the City Administrator to apply for funding from WSDOT for up to \$250,000 under the 2016 Pedestrian and Bicycle and Safe Routes to School Programs. Second by Councilmember Schermann and the motion carried unanimously.

Water Service Request
Status Update**

Mr. Gordon gave Council an update on the status of the request for water service from Christ Community Fellowship. Funding that was available from the Department of Health was reviewed. At this time, it does not appear that DOH would be able to provide the funding that the City originally believed would be available. Mr. Gordon reviewed some of the options that were available that would provide a benefit to the City's water system and solve the CCF issue. It was noted that staff would keep working with CCF to try to resolve the problem.

CARS Project Update

Mr. Hartwig gave an update on the progress of the CARS project. He reported that paving work is continuing on the north portion of the project. He stated that once striping and signage was complete on North College Avenue, it would be opened to traffic.

Change orders and the contingency amount were reviewed.

Council expressed their thanks for staff and their hard work on this project and commented how nice it looked.

Mr. Reay stated that more financial information would be brought for the next report to Council.

Mr. Gordon commended Mr. Hartwig on his work in the streets for utility coordination.

Surplus Property Discussion Maple Avenue

Mr. Reay discussed a piece of City owned property on Maple Avenue that had originally been purchased for the Eastside Booster Station. This is a remnant property that is owned by the water system. Once the property was platted an appraisal would be performed and staff would come back to Council to determine a price for the property and request authorization to surplus.

Staffing Discussion

Mayor Scott noted that Mr. Reay would be leaving the City to accept the Executive Director position with the Port of Walla Walla. She discussed the potential for combining the searches for both Police Chief and City Administrator. The possibility of hiring an interim City Administrator was discussed.

New Fire Engine

Mr. Reay informed the Council that the new fire engine had been delivered and was available for the council to look at after the meeting.

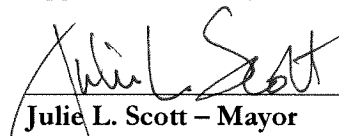

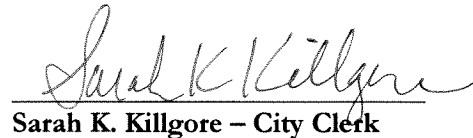

A resolution to establish rules of conduct for council meetings

1 General rules

1.1 Meetings to be public: all official meetings of the council shall be open to the public with the exception of the executive sessions for certain limited topics, as defined in section

1.2 Quorum: four councilmembers shall be in attendance to constitute a quorum and be necessary for the transaction of business. If a quorum is not present, those in attendance will be named and they shall adjourn to a later time.

1.3 Compelling attendance: the council might adjourn from day-to-day to compel the attendance of absent members.

1.4 Journal of proceedings: an account of all proceedings of the council shall be kept by the city clerk and shall be entered in a book constituting the official record of the council.

A. In the event of a vacancy on the Council or in the Office of Mayor, the City Clerk shall, within two weeks of the occurrence of such vacancy, publish a notice in the Walla Walla Union Bulletin notifying of such vacancy and soliciting written applications from qualified persons to fill such vacancy. The applications shall be accompanied by a written questionnaire to be completed by each applicant. Such notice shall be in a form acceptable to the City Administrator and the City Attorney.

Applicants will be asked to remain in the foyer when each separate applicant is interviewed, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the applicants as a group shall be advised that if anyone of them objects to this process, then they shall all be permitted to remain in Council Chambers for each interview conducted.

E. At the conclusion of all interviews the Council shall adjourn to executive session pursuant to RCW 43.30.110(1)(h) to evaluate the qualifications of the applicants, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that final action appointing an applicant to office shall be in a meeting open to the public.

F. Upon completion of the Executive Session, Council shall return to open session and the Mayor or Mayor Pro Tem shall request nominations from Councilmembers, who may then nominate the applicants of their choice. A second shall be required for each nomination. Only those that submitted applications shall be eligible for nomination.

G. Council members shall then vote for the nominees of their choice. Absent members shall be permitted to vote by phone. The nominee with the majority of the votes cast is then

3.4 questions to be stated: the chairman shall state all questions submitted for a vote and announce the result. A roll call vote shall be taken upon the request of any member.

3.5 no member shall speak more than twice on the same subject without permission

of the presiding officer.

3.6 motions to reconsider must be by a member who voted with the majority, and at the same or next succeeding meeting of the council.

3.7 each member present should vote on all questions put to the council, except as to matters with respect to which such council member has a disqualifying interest.

3.8 the presiding officer of the council may, at his or her discretion call any member to take the chair, to allow him or her to address the council, make a motion, or discuss any other matter at issue.

3.9 all questions of order shall be decided by the presiding officer of the council with the right to appeal to the council by any member

3.10 a motion for adjournment shall always be in order.

4 Creation of committees, boards, and commissions

4.1 Citizen committees, boards and commissions: the council may create committees, boards, and commissions to assist in the conduct of the operation of the city government with such duties as the council or mayor may specify.

All remarks shall be addressed to the council as a body, and not to any member thereof. No person, other than members of the council and the person having the floor, shall be permitted to enter into any discussion, either directly or through the members of the council. No

1.7 City Attorney: The City Attorney shall attend all meetings of the Council, unless excused by the Mayor. Any member of the Council may, at any time during a regular or special meeting of the Council, call upon the City Attorney for an oral or written opinion to decide any question of law.

1.8 City Clerk: The City Clerk, or such other person as the Mayor may designate, shall be ex-officio Clerk of the Council and shall keep minutes of the meeting and perform such other further duties in the meeting as may be ordered by the Mayor.

1.9 Officers and Employees to Attend: The head of any department or any officer or employee of the city, when requested by the Mayor, or the City Council, shall attend any regular, executive or special meeting and confer with the Council on matters relating to the city.

1.10 Conflict of Interest: A Council member may not vote on a matter where he or she would be especially benefitted and shall absent himself or herself from Council Chambers during the time said matter is being discussed and voted on by the Council.

1.11 Procedures for Filling Vacated Positions

- a. In the event of a vacancy on the Council or in the Office of Mayor, the City Clerk shall, within two weeks of the occurrence of such vacancy, publish a notice in the Walla Walla Union Bulletin notifying of such vacancy and soliciting written applications from qualified persons to fill such vacancy. The applications shall be accompanied by a written questionnaire to be completed by each applicant. Such notice shall be in a form acceptable to the City Administrator and the City Attorney.
- b. Such notice shall establish a deadline for the submission of applications and answers to the questionnaires, which shall be no less than fifteen (15) days from the date the notice is published.
- c. Once this deadline has passed, the City Clerk shall review each application to ensure that each applicant is a registered voter of the City at time of application, and has been a resident of the City for at least one year.
- d. Once the Clerk has reviewed the applications to determine eligibility per the provisions of the preceding paragraph of this resolution, those applicants that are determined to be eligible shall be notified to appear before the Council to submit to an interview by the Council. Applicants will be asked to remain in the foyer when each separate applicant is interviewed, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the applicants as a group shall be advised that if anyone of them objects to this process, then they shall all be permitted to remain in Council Chambers for each interview conducted.
- e. At the conclusion of all interviews the Council shall adjourn to executive session pursuant to RCW 43.30.110(1)(h) to evaluate the qualifications of the applicants, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that final action appointing an applicant to office shall be in a meeting open to the public.
- f. Upon completion of the Executive Session, Council shall return to open session and the Mayor or Mayor Pro Tem shall request nominations from Council Members, who may

then nominate the applicants of their choice. A second shall be required for each nomination. Only those that submitted applications shall be eligible for nomination.

- g. Council members shall then vote for the nominees of their choice. Absent members shall be permitted to vote by phone. The nominee with the majority of the votes cast is then selected to fill the vacancy. In the event of a tie, the Mayor may vote. If no candidate receives a majority vote, Council may adopt motions to enable it to complete the election by majority vote within a reasonable time.

Section 2: Types of Meetings:

2.1 Regular Council meeting: The Council meeting dates and times shall be set by Ordinance and specified in Title 2 – Administration of the College Place Municipal Code.

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- b. Before convening in executive session, the presiding officer must publicly announce the purpose for excluding the public and the time when the executive session will conclude. The executive session may be extended by an announcement of the presiding officer. (RCW 4-2.30.100 (2))
- c. Final adoption of an "ordinance resolution, rule, regulation, order or directive" must be done in the "open" meeting. (RCW 42.30.060)

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3.1 Chairman: The Mayor, if present, shall preside as chairperson at all meetings of the Council. In the absence of the Mayor, the Mayor pro-tem shall preside. In the absence of both the Mayor and the Mayor pro-tem, the Council shall elect a chairperson.

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a majority vote of the Council. No committee so appointed shall have powers other than advisory to the Council or to the Mayor unless otherwise specified.

4.3 Removal of members of boards and commissions: The Council may remove any member of any board or commission which it has created by a vote of at least a majority of the Council.

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5.1 Addressing the Council: Any person desiring to address the Council by oral communication shall first secure the permission of the Presiding Officer.

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5.3 Personal and slanderous remarks: Any person making personal, impertinent or slanderous remarks, or who shall become boisterous, while addressing the Council may be requested to leave the meeting and may be forthwith, by the Presiding Officer, barred from further audience before the Council during that Council meeting.

5.4 Reading of protests: Interested persons, or their authorized representatives, may address the Council for the reading of protest, petitions, or communications relating to any matter over which the Council has control, when the item is under consideration by the Council, if a majority of the Council present agrees to let them be heard.

5.5 Mayor may appoint committee or refer citizens' complaints: The Mayor may appoint a committee of three members of the city Council to hear citizen's complaints or may refer citizen's complaints to an executive session of the City Council, whenever the subject would be appropriate.

5.6 Written communications: Interested parties, or their authorized representatives, may address the Council by written communication in regard to any matter concerning the city's business or over which the Council had control at any time by direct mail or by addressing the City Clerk and copies will be distributed to the Council Members.

Section 6: Suspension and Amendment of These Rules:

6.1 Suspension of these rules: Any provision of these rules may be temporarily suspended by a vote of a majority of the Council. The vote on any such suspension shall be taken by ayes and nays and entered upon the record.

6.2 Amendment of these rules: These rules may be amended, or new rules adopted, by a majority vote of all members of the Council, provided that the proposed amendments or new rules shall have been introduced into the record at prior Council meeting.

Section 7: Parliamentary Procedure:

7.1 The Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure shall govern the deliberations of the Council when there is no specific guideline set in the foregoing rules, subsequent City of College Place Ordinances and Resolutions, or the statutes of the State of Washington – Specifically RCW 35A

Section 8: Clerical Corrections.

8.1 The City Clerk is authorized to make necessary clerical corrections to this resolution including, but not limited to, the correction of scrivener's/clerical errors, references, resolution numbering, section/subsection numbers and any references thereto.

Section 9: Effective Date.

9.1 This resolution shall take effect and be in full force upon its passage as provided by law.

Dear Mr. Gordon:

Over the last month Schneider Water Services (Schneider) has struggled with stabilizing the unlined lower borehole, that portion of the borehole below the 24-inch. diameter steel casing, starting at approximately 515 ft. BGS. Sloughing from basalt and clay formations continues to fill the borehole causing delays to construction and increase project costs.

Schneider saw a reduced amount of sloughing during the week of January 13th, 2020 and thought that the borehole had stabilized, but last week the sloughing returned. It is now the opinion of the Schneider and RH2 Engineering, Inc. (RH2) that the lower borehole will not stabilize enough to set the permanent liner without some support from a temporary liner. Schneider has proposed the following options.

- **Option No. 1** – Stop drilling at the current depth of 685 ft. BGS, clean out the borehole, and try to set the permanent 20" liner without any temporary support.
- **Option No. 2** – Drill to 730' BGS and set a temporary 20" steel liner, install an 18" permanent stainless-steel liner within the temporary liner, and extract the temporary liner.
- **Option No. 3** – Drill to 800' BGS and set a temporary 20" steel liner, install an 18" permanent stainless-steel liner within the temporary liner, and extract the temporary liner.

The RH2 projected contract costs for all three options are attached as **Attachment A**. Please note that these estimates include the cost for a temporary well testing discharge pipe that is estimated at \$100,000. RH2 and Schneider are currently working to finalize the costs for the discharge pipe.

Option No. 1 is not recommended due to the borehole instability and groundwater levels continuing to drop in the vicinity of the well. While Option No 2. would stabilize the borehole, drilling to 730 ft. BGS may not produce much, if any, additional yield due to continued sloughing and disturbance from 630 ft. BGS to 680 ft.

RH2 recommends the City budgets for Option No. 3. Drilling closer to 800 ft. BGS would increase the chances of getting additional yield from a lower water bearing formation and provide the possibility for the pump to be set lower if groundwater levels continue to drop.

Review of Test Well #2 Change Requests

The Committee met 1/23/20 with Mike Rizzitello, Paul Hartwig, Robert Gordon, and Carolyn Holm to review the situation and our options.

RH2, our engineer, provided us with a letter discussing options based on their oversight of our drilling contractor, Schneider Equipment, Inc. We discussed the three options and the pros and cons of each. We agreed that the City should pursue option 3 – dig deeper by using a temporary casing.

We reviewed the cost breakdown and realized that RH2 was only accounting for the contractor part of the contract not all of what we allocated. It appeared to us that the crosswalk was something like:

This letter describes the bid results from January 16, 2020 for the Lamperti Street Overlay and Sidewalk Project.

Bid Results from January 16, 2020

Bids for the project were received and opened at College Place City Hall on January 16, 2020 at 2:00 p.m. The City received five bids from the following bidders:

1. Don Jackson Excavation, LLC
2. P.O.W. Contracting
3. Humbert Asphalt, Inc.
4. Eastern Oregon Contracting, LLC
5. Nelson Construction Corp

All bids were opened and read. After the bid opening, the bids were reviewed again, and the Bidder Responsibility Criteria pursuant to the Revised Code of Washington 39.04.010 was examined with respect to the lowest bidder (see attached). Two bidders were found to be unresponsive, Eastern Oregon Contracting, LLC and Nelson Construction Corp. Eastern Oregon Contracting, LLC failed to complete the Bidder's Performance and Payment Bond Statement. Nelson Construction Corp failed to be complete the Bidder's Performance and Payment Bond Statement, Certification of Compliance with Wage Payment Statutes, and the Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, and Other Responsibility Matters.

After the bid opening, we entered the bid prices into a Microsoft Excel spreadsheet to check the price extensions and verify that the total bid amounts read matched the amounts written on each bid. Minor errors were found in the bids from Don Jackson Excavation, LLC, Eastern Oregon Contracting, LLC and Humbert Asphalt, Inc. These errors were corrected and did not change the outcome of the bid. A copy of the Bid Tabulation, which shows the bidders' prices and costs for each individual bid item, is attached. All corrections to the bids are shown on the Bid Tabulation as shaded.

The bid totals for the base bid ranged from \$218,667.96 to \$287,439.44. The Engineer's Estimate was \$265,260.00.

The apparent low bidder is Don Jackson Excavation, LLC. Their bid was \$46,592.04 lower than the Engineer's Estimate.

Summary

From our review of the bids, we recommend the City of College Place consider awarding the Lamperti Street Overlay and Sidewalk Project to Don Jackson Excavation, LLC, contingent upon approval from the City's Attorney and the Transportation Improvement Board.

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT represents that he/she is in compliance with the Washington State Statutes relating to professional registration, if applicable, and has signified a willingness to furnish Consulting services to the AGENCY,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the terms, conditions, covenants and performance contained herein, or attached and incorporated and made a part hereof, the parties hereto agree as follows:

I GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF WORK

The work under this AGREEMENT shall consist of the above described work and services as herein defined and necessary to accomplish the completed work for this PROJECT. The CONSULTANT shall furnish all services, labor and related

equipment necessary to conduct and complete the work as designated elsewhere in this AGREEMENT.



II SCOPE OF WORK

The Scope of Work and project level of effort for this project is detailed in Exhibit B attached hereto, and by this reference made a part of this AGREEMENT.

III GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

All aspects of coordination of the work of this AGREEMENT, with outside agencies, groups or individuals shall receive advance approval by the AGENCY. Necessary contacts and meetings with agencies, groups or individuals shall be coordinated through the AGENCY.

The CONSULTANT shall attend coordination, progress and presentation meetings with the AGENCY or such Federal, Community, State, City or County officials, groups or individuals as may be requested by the AGENCY. The AGENCY will provide the CONSULTANT sufficient notice prior to meetings requiring CONSULTANT participation. The minimum number of hours or days notice required shall be agreed to between the AGENCY and the CONSULTANT and shown in Exhibit B attached hereto and made part of this AGREEMENT. The CONSULTANT shall prepare a monthly progress report, in a form approved by the AGENCY, that will outline in written and graphical form the various phases and the order of performance of the work in sufficient detail so that the progress of the work can easily be evaluated. Goals for Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE), Minority Business Enterprises (MBE), and Women-owned Business Enterprises (WBE) if required shall be shown in the heading of this Agreement.

The original copies of all reports, PS&E, and other data furnished to the CONSULTANT by the AGENCY shall be returned. All designs, drawings, specifications, documents, and other work products prepared by the CONSULTANT prior to completion or termination of this AGREEMENT are instruments of service for the PROJECT and are property of the AGENCY. Reuse by the AGENCY or by others acting through or on behalf of the AGENCY of any such instruments of service, not occurring as a part of this PROJECT, shall be without liability of legal exposure to the CONSULTANT.

IV TIME FOR BEGINNING AND COMPLETION

The CONSULTANT shall not begin any work under the terms of this AGREEMENT until authorized in writing by the AGENCY. All work under this AGREEMENT shall be completed by the date shown in the heading of this AGREEMENT under completion date.

The established completion time shall not be extended because of any delays attributable to the CONSULTANT, but may be extended by the AGENCY, in the event of a delay attributable to the AGENCY, or because of unavoidable delays caused by an act of GOD or governmental actions or other conditions beyond the control of the CONSULTANT. A prior supplemental agreement issued by the AGENCY is required to extend the established completion time.

V PAYMENT

The CONSULTANT shall be paid by the AGENCY for completed work and services rendered under this AGREEMENT as provided in Exhibit C attached hereto, and by this reference made part of this AGREEMENT. Such payment shall be full compensation for work performed or services rendered and for all labor, materials, supplies, equipment, and incidentals necessary to complete the work specified in Section II, Scope of Work.

VI

SUBCONTRACTING

The AGENCY permits subcontracts for those items of work as shown in Exhibit G to this Agreement. Compensation for this subconsultant work shall be based on the cost factors shown on Exhibit G, attached hereto and by this reference made a part of this AGREEMENT.

The work of the subconsultant shall not exceed its maximum amount payable unless a prior written approval has been issued by the AGENCY.

All reimbursable direct labor, overhead, direct non-salary costs and fixed fee costs for the subconsultant shall be substantiated in the same manner as outlined in Section V. All subcontracts exceeding \$10,000 in cost shall contain all applicable provisions of this AGREEMENT.

The CONSULTANT shall not subcontract for the performance of any work under this AGREEMENT without prior written permission of the AGENCY. No permission for subcontracting shall create, between the AGENCY and subcontractor, any contract or any other relationship.

VII EMPLOYMENT

The CONSULTANT warrants that he/she has not employed or retained any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the CONSULTANT, to solicit or secure this contract, and that it has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the CONSULTANT, any fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or any other consideration, contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this contract. For breach or violation of this warrant, the AGENCY shall have the right to annul this AGREEMENT without liability, or in its discretion, to deduct from the AGREEMENT price or consideration or otherwise recover the full amount of such fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift, or contingent fee.

Any and all employees of the CONSULTANT or other persons while engaged in the performance of any work or services required of the CONSULTANT under this AGREEMENT, shall be considered employees of the CONSULTANT only and not of the AGENCY, and any and all claims that may or might arise under any Worker's Compensation Act on behalf of said employees or other persons while so engaged, and any and all claims made by a third party as a consequence of any act or omission on the part of the CONSULTANT's employees or other persons while so engaged on any of the work or services provided to be rendered herein, shall be the sole obligation and responsibility of the CONSULTANT.

The CONSULTANT shall not engage, on a full or part time basis, or other basis, during the period of the contract, any professional or technical personnel who are, or have been, at any time during the period of the contract, in the employ of the STATE, or the AGENCY, except regularly retired employees, without written consent of the public employer of such person.

VIII NONDISCRIMINATION

The CONSULTANT agrees not to discriminate against any client, employee or applicant for employment or for services because of race, creed, color, national origin, marital status, sex, age or handicap except for a bona fide occupational qualification with regard to, but not limited to the following: employment upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or any recruitment advertising, layoffs or terminations, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, selection for training, rendition of services. The CONSULTANT understands and agrees that if it violates this provision, this AGREEMENT may be terminated by the AGENCY and further that the CONSULTANT shall be barred from performing any services for the AGENCY now or in the future unless a showing is made satisfactory to the AGENCY that discriminatory practices have terminated and that recurrence of such action is unlikely.



During the performance of this AGREEMENT, the CONSULTANT, for itself, its assignees, and successors in interest agrees as follows:

- A. **COMPLIANCE WITH REGULATIONS:** The CONSULTANT shall comply with the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination in the same manner as in Federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 21, as they may be amended from time to time, (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations), which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this AGREEMENT.
- B. **NONDISCRIMINATION:** The CONSULTANT, with regard to the work performed by it during the AGREEMENT, shall not discriminate on the grounds of race, creed, color, sex, age, marital status, national origin or handicap except for a bona fide occupational qualification in the selection and retention of subconsultants, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment. The CONSULTANT shall not participate either directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by Section 21.5 of the Regulations, including employment practices when the contract covers a program set forth in Appendix II of the Regulations.
- C. **SOLICITATIONS FOR SUBCONSULTANTS, INCLUDING PROCUREMENTS OF MATERIALS AND EQUIPMENT:** In all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the CONSULTANT for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials or leases of equipment, each potential subconsultant or supplier shall be notified by the CONSULTANT of the CONSULTANT's obligations under this AGREEMENT and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, creed, color, sex, age, marital status, national origin and handicap.
- D. **INFORMATION AND REPORTS:** The CONSULTANT shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations, or directives issued pursuant thereto, and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the AGENCY or TIB to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Regulations or directives. Where any information required of the CONSULTANT is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information the CONSULTANT shall so certify to the AGENCY, or the TIB as appropriate, and shall set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.
- E. **SANCTIONS FOR NONCOMPLIANCE:** In the event of the CONSULTANT's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of this AGREEMENT, the AGENCY shall impose such sanctions as it or the Transportation Improvement Board may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
 1. Withholding of payments to the CONSULTANT under the AGREEMENT until the CONSULTANT complies, and/or
 2. Cancellation, termination or suspension of the AGREEMENT, in whole or in part.
- F. **INCORPORATION OF PROVISIONS:** The CONSULTANT shall include the provisions of paragraphs (A) through (G) in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto. The CONSULTANT shall take such action with respect to any subconsultant or procurement as the AGENCY or the Transportation Improvement Board may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance; provided, however, that, in the event a CONSULTANT becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subconsultant or supplier as a result of such direction, the CONSULTANT may request the AGENCY to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the AGENCY, and in addition, the CONSULTANT may request the TIB to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the TIB.
- G. **UNFAIR EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES:** The CONSULTANT shall comply with RCW 49.60.180 prohibiting unfair employment practices and the Executive Orders numbered E.O.70-01 and E.O.66-03 of the Governor of the State of Washington.

IX TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

The right is reserved by the AGENCY to terminate this AGREEMENT at any time upon ten days written notice to the CONSULTANT.

In the event this AGREEMENT is terminated by the AGENCY other than for fault on the part of the CONSULTANT, a final payment shall be made to the CONSULTANT as shown in Exhibit F for the type of AGREEMENT used.

No payment shall be made for any work completed after ten days following receipt by the CONSULTANT of the Notice of Termination. If the accumulated payment made to the CONSULTANT prior to Notice of Termination exceeds the total amount that would be due computed as set forth herein above, then no final payment shall be due and the CONSULTANT shall immediately reimburse the AGENCY for any excess paid.

In the event the services of the CONSULTANT are terminated by the AGENCY for fault on the part of the CONSULTANT, the above formula for payment shall not apply. In such an event, the amount to be paid shall be determined by the AGENCY with consideration given to the actual costs incurred by the CONSULTANT in performing the work to the date of termination, the amount of work originally required which was satisfactorily completed to date of termination, whether that work is in a form or a type which is usable to the AGENCY at the time of termination; the cost to the AGENCY of employing another firm to complete the work required and the time which maybe required to do so, and other factors which affect the value to the AGENCY of the work performed at the time of termination. Under no circumstances shall payment made under this subsection exceed the amount which would have been made using the formula set forth in the previous paragraph.

If it is determined for any reason that the CONSULTANT was not in default or that the CONSULTANT's failure to perform is without it or its employees fault or negligence, the termination shall be deemed to be a termination for the convenience of the AGENCY in accordance with the provision of this AGREEMENT.

In the event of the death of any member, partner or officer of the CONSULTANT or any of its supervisory personnel assigned to the project, or, dissolution of the partnership, termination of the corporation, or disaffiliation of the principally involved employee, the surviving members of the CONSULTANT hereby agree to complete the work under the terms of this AGREEMENT, if requested to do so by the AGENCY. The subsection shall not be a bar to renegotiation of the AGREEMENT between the surviving members of the CONSULTANT and the AGENCY, if the AGENCY so chooses.

In the event of the death of any of the parties listed in the previous paragraph, should the surviving members of the CONSULTANT, with the AGENCY's concurrence, desire to terminate this AGREEMENT, payment shall be made as set forth in the second paragraph of this section.

In the event this AGREEMENT is terminated prior to completion, the original copies of all reports and other data, PS&E materials furnished to the CONSULTANT by the AGENCY and documents prepared by the CONSULTANT prior to said termination, shall become and remain the property of the AGENCY and may be used by it without restriction. Such unrestricted use, not occurring as a part of this PROJECT, shall be without liability or legal exposure to the CONSULTANT.

Payment for any part of the work by the AGENCY shall not constitute a waiver by the AGENCY of any remedies of any type it may have against the



CONSULTANT for any breach of this AGREEMENT by the CONSULTANT, or for failure of the CONSULTANT to perform work required of it by the AGENCY. Forbearance of any rights under the AGREEMENT will not constitute waiver of entitlement to exercise those rights with respect to any future act or omission by the CONSULTANT.

X CHANGES OF WORK

The CONSULTANT shall make such changes and revisions in the complete work of this AGREEMENT as necessary to correct errors appearing therein, when required to do so by the AGENCY, without additional compensation thereof. Should the AGENCY find it desirable for its own purposes to have previously satisfactorily completed work or parts thereof changed or revised, the CONSULTANT shall make such revisions as directed by the AGENCY. This work shall be considered as Extra Work and will be paid for as herein provided under Section XIV.

XI DISPUTES

Any dispute concerning questions of fact in connection with the work not disposed of by AGREEMENT between the CONSULTANT and the AGENCY shall be referred for determination to the Director of Public Works or AGENCY Engineer, whose decision in the matter shall be final and binding on the parties of this AGREEMENT, provided however, that if an action is brought challenging the Director of Public Works or AGENCY Engineer's decision, that decision shall be subject to the scope of judicial review provided under Washington Case Law.

XII VENUE, APPLICABLE LAW AND PERSONAL JURISDICTION

In the event that either party deems it necessary to institute legal action or proceedings to enforce any right or obligation under this AGREEMENT, the parties hereto agree that any such action shall be initiated in the Superior Court of the State of Washington, situated in the county the AGENCY is located in. The parties hereto agree that all questions shall be resolved by application of Washington law and that the parties to such action shall have the right of appeal from such decisions of the Superior court in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington. The CONSULTANT hereby consents to the personal jurisdiction of the Superior Court of the State of Washington, situated in the county the AGENCY is located in.

XIII LEGAL RELATIONS AND INSURANCE

The CONSULTANT shall comply with all Federal, State, and local laws and ordinances applicable to the work to be done under this AGREEMENT. This AGREEMENT shall be interpreted and construed in accord with the laws of Washington.

The CONSULTANT shall indemnify and hold the AGENCY and the STATE of Washington, and their officers and employees harmless from and shall process and defend at its own expense all claims, demands, or suits at law or equity arising in whole or in part from the CONSULTANT's negligence or breach of any of its obligations under this AGREEMENT; provided that nothing herein shall require a CONSULTANT to indemnify the AGENCY and the STATE against and hold harmless the AGENCY and the STATE from claims, demands or suits based solely upon the conduct of the AGENCY and the STATE, their agents, officers and employees and provided further that if the claims or suits are caused by or result from the concurrent negligence of (a) the CONSULTANT's agents or employees and (b) the AGENCY and the STATE, their agents, officers and employees, this indemnity provision with respect to (1) claims or suits based upon such negligence, (2) the costs to the AGENCY and the STATE of defending such claims and suits, etc. shall be valid and enforceable only to the extent of the CONSULTANT's negligence or the negligence of the CONSULTANT's agents or employees.

The CONSULTANT's relation to the AGENCY shall be at all times as an independent contractor.

The CONSULTANT specifically assumes potential liability for actions brought by the CONSULTANT's own employees against the AGENCY and, solely for the purpose of this indemnification and defense, the CONSULTANT specifically waives any immunity under the state industrial insurance law, Title 51 RCW. The CONSULTANT recognizes that this waiver was specifically entered into pursuant to the provisions of RCW 4.24.115 and was the subject of mutual negotiation.

Unless otherwise specified in the AGREEMENT, the AGENCY shall be responsible for administration of construction contracts, if any, on the project. Subject to the processing of an acceptable, supplemental agreement, the CONSULTANT shall provide on-call assistance to the AGENCY during contract administration. By providing such assistance, the CONSULTANT shall assume no responsibility for: proper construction techniques, job site safety, or any construction contractor's failure to perform its work in accordance with the contract documents.

The CONSULTANT shall obtain and keep in force during the terms of the AGREEMENT, or as otherwise required, the following insurance with companies or through sources approved by the State Insurance Commissioner pursuant to RCW 48.

Insurance Coverage

A. Worker's compensation and employer's liability insurance as required by the STATE.

B. General commercial liability insurance in an amount not less than a single limit of one million and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for bodily injury, including death and property damage per occurrence.

Excepting the Worker's Compensation insurance and any professional liability insurance secured by the CONSULTANT, the AGENCY will be named on all certificates of insurance as an additional insured. The CONSULTANT shall furnish the AGENCY with verification of insurance and endorsements required by this AGREEMENT. The AGENCY reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies at any time.

All insurance shall be obtained from an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of Washington. The CONSULTANT shall submit a verification of insurance as outlined above within 14 days of the execution of this AGREEMENT to the AGENCY. No cancellation of the foregoing policies shall be effective without thirty (30) days prior notice to the AGENCY.

The CONSULTANT's professional liability to the AGENCY shall be limited to the amount payable under this AGREEMENT or one million dollars, whichever is the greater unless modified by Exhibit H. In no case shall the CONSULTANT's professional liability to third parties be limited in any way.

The AGENCY will pay no progress payments under Section V until the CONSULTANT has fully complied with this section. This remedy is not exclusive; and the AGENCY and the STATE may take such other action as is available to them under other provisions of this AGREEMENT, or otherwise in law.

XIV EXTRA WORK

A. The AGENCY may at any time, by written order, make changes within the general scope of the AGREEMENT in the services to be performed.

B. If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the estimated cost of, or the time required for, performance of any part of the work under this AGREEMENT, whether or not changed by the order, or otherwise affects any other terms and conditions of the AGREEMENT, the AGENCY shall make an equitable adjustment in the (1) maximum amount payable; (2) delivery or completion schedule, or both; and (3) other affected terms and shall modify the AGREEMENT accordingly.



- C. The CONSULTANT must submit any proposal for adjustment (hereafter referred to as proposal) under this clause within 30 days from the date of receipt of the written order. However, if the AGENCY decides that the facts justify it, the AGENCY may receive and act upon a proposal submitted before final payment of the AGREEMENT.
- D. Failure to agree to any adjustment shall be a dispute under the disputes clause. However nothing in this clause shall excuse the CONSULTANT from proceeding with the AGREEMENT as changed.
- E. Notwithstanding the terms and condition of paragraphs (a) and (b) above, the maximum amount payable for this AGREEMENT, shall not be increased or considered to be increased except by specific written supplement to this AGREEMENT.

**XV
ENDORSEMENT OF PLANS**

The CONSULTANT shall place his endorsement on all plans, estimates or any other engineering data furnished by him.

**XVI
TIB AND AGENCY REVIEW**

The AGENCY and TIB shall have the right to participate in the review or examination of the work in progress.

**XVII
CERTIFICATION OF THE
CONSULTANT AND THE AGENCY**

COMPLETE AGREEMENT**

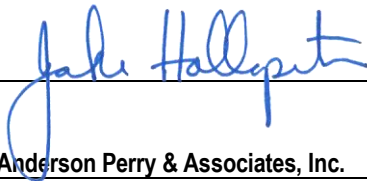

EXHIBIT B-1 Scope of Work

Describe the Scope of Work

The work consists of the design and preparation of construction bidding documents for roadway and sidewalk improvements on Meadowbrook Boulevard between Lamperti Street and State Route (SR) 125. The entire project is located within the city limits of College Place, Washington.

The CONSULTANT shall provide plans, specifications, engineer's estimate, and complete bid documents necessary for the construction of the project.

The work shall include the following:

- Coordinate a project development schedule with the AGENCY and deliver all products within the mutually developed schedule.
- Conduct field surveys and prepare a design survey base map (as needed).
- If necessary, prepare for and attend one AGENCY Council meeting for the project.
- Design improvements, including roadway improvements (spot repairs, grinding, crack sealing, overlay), sidewalk, ADA ramps, and other related facilities included in the funding application.
- Coordinate design efforts with the Washington State Department of Transportation for replacement of signal control loops and construction staging to minimize impacts to traffic on SR 125.
- Answer bidder's questions, prepare addendums if needed, attend the bid opening, prepare a bid summary/tabulation, make recommendations to the AGENCY on the construction contract award to the lowest responsive bidder, and perform other related tasks during the bid phase.

The project is anticipated to be categorically exempt from the State Environmental Policy Act. A Stormwater Permit from the Washington State Department of Ecology should not be needed, and a Cultural Resource Report should not be required. Right-of-way acquisition is not anticipated. Therefore, assistance is not included for these items.

Design features shall include:

- The improvements shall be designed to the standards as listed in the Transportation Improvement Board (TIB) application and Washington State Department of Transportation Local Agency Guidelines.
- Sidewalk shall be replaced in locations where sidewalk is failing or does not meet ADA compliance per direction from the AGENCY.
- ADA compliant ramps shall be included at each street crossing, as needed, based on the results of an AGENCY evaluation of ADA compliance.

Documents to be Furnished by the CONSULTANT

1. Up to two sets of preliminary plans for review of approximately 30 and 90 percent completion stages of the project.
2. Two sets of bidding documents with engineer's estimate for final review and authorization to advertise for bids. One set each for the AGENCY and TIB.
3. Up to five sets of final bidding documents and an engineer's estimate for the AGENCY's use.
4. Quest CDN will be utilized for the bidding process.

The AGENCY, at their option, may supplement this Agreement to include construction administration services.



EXHIBIT C-1

Payment

(Lump Sum)

A. Lump Sum Agreement

Payment for all consulting services for this project shall be on the basis of a lump sum amount as shown in the heading of this AGREEMENT.

The maximum amount payable, by the AGENCY to the CONSULTANT under this AGREEMENT, shall not exceed the amount shown in the heading of this AGREEMENT as maximum amount payable unless a supplemental agreement has been negotiated and executed by the AGENCY prior to incurring any costs in excess of the maximum amount payable.

B. Monthly Progress Payments

Partial payments may be made upon request of the CONSULTANT to cover the percentage of work completed and are not to be more frequent than one (1) per month.

C. Final Payment

Final payment of any balance due the CONSULTANT of the gross amount earned will be made promptly upon its verification by the AGENCY after the completion of the work under this AGREEMENT contingent upon receipt of all PS&E, plans, maps notes, reports, and other related documents which are required to be furnished under the AGREEMENT. Acceptance of such final payment by the CONSULTANT shall constitute a release of all claims for payment which the CONSULTANT may have against the AGENCY unless such claims are specifically reserved in writing and transmitted to the AGENCY by the CONSULTANT prior to its acceptance. Said final payment shall not, however, be a bar to any claims the AGENCY may have against the CONSULTANT or to any remedies the AGENCY may pursue with respect to such claims.

D. Inspection of Cost Records

The CONSULTANT and his/her subconsultants shall keep available for inspection by representatives of the AGENCY and/or the TIB for a period of three years after final payment the cost records and accounts pertaining to this AGREEMENT and all items related to or bearing upon these records with the following exception: if any litigation, claim, or audit arising out of, in connection with, or related to this contract is initiated before the expiration of the three-year period, the cost records and accounts shall be retained until such litigation, claim or audit involving the records is completed.

Subject: Scope of Work for College Place Land Application

Dear Paul

We are pleased to submit the attached scope of work and fee estimate to provide engineering support for an evaluation of tree replanting at your irrigated land application system and to assess development of new land. The goal of the land application system is to maximize water use by the crops on the land available for land application in order to meet wastewater discharge requirements to the river during the critical times of the year. We propose to assess the potential of expansion and improvements to the site by considering the replanting of poplar trees and perhaps other crops and evaluating the irrigation system to maximize the effectiveness of the land application system. Our proposed work scope includes the following tasks. Project management is included in each of the tasks. It will consist of communication with the Project manager, internal coordination with the project team and invoicing.

1. Review Existing Data & Site Visit

Review the existing data including influent and effluent water quantity and quality for the wastewater treatment plant, and the site characteristics of the existing land application site and possible expansion areas.

Jacobs' land application expert, will spend one day at the site with the College Place staff and the site farmer to walk the site and visit the potential available land application areas. Afterwards, the expert and local staff will review the observations and discuss potential alternatives for land application to identify optimal footprints, poplar tree replanting and the possibility of using other crops, and irrigation system alternatives including some automation.

2. Develop Conceptual Layout and Plan

A feasibility study will be conducted to assess alternative land application system concepts to maximize treatment while considering site requirements, area footprint, and other constraints. Jacobs proprietary rootzone water balance model will be used to evaluate the capacity of various land application configurations. The model is calibrated with local climate data, crop water use and

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growth characteristics, irrigation system, and area footprint to develop the water balance for the layout plan and flow. The calibrated model will be adjusted to evaluate different flows, crops, area, and irrigation. We will use the model to identify the total area required for treatment, make comparisons between potential footprints, or evaluate the loading capacity of a fixed available area.

A conceptual design technical memorandum will be prepared, consolidating the information developed above and presenting the recommended land application configuration. 10% conceptual design 11x17 drawings of the layout will be included in the technical memorandum to document the layout concept. Implementation of the project in phases can be included as supplemental, if needed.

Schedule

The site visit is expected to take place in mid to late January or early February. The remaining tasks are anticipated to be completed in February.

Budget

The budget for this proposal will be provided in a separate attachment. Jacobs Engineering Group proposes to complete this work on a Time & Materials as an add-on task to the existing operations contract.

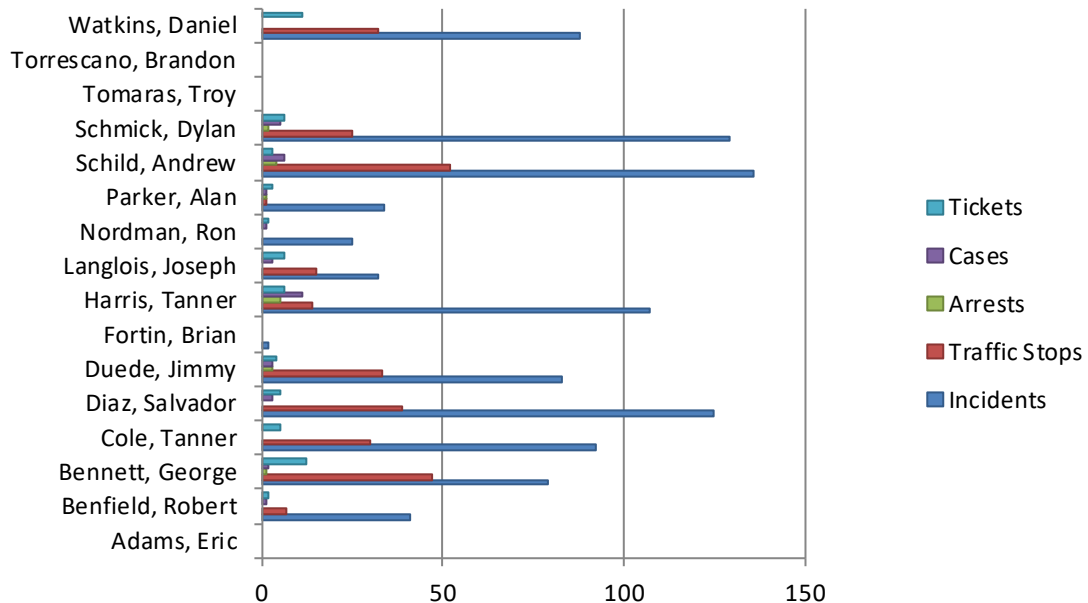
